- New projects stalled, but still burning through backlog post Covid.
- Will the labour shortage shift in 1.5-2 years and not be an issue?
- In the past 10 years hundreds of projects should have gone ahead but there isn't the capacity in BC to do it.
- o Differences between public project delays vs. private.
- Cost of labour unrealistic, but Vancouver cost of living is an factor
- Some estimate shortage of 30,000 skilled labourers in BC.
- We need to look 6 months to 5 years ahead how can we deliver without labourers?
- Labour shortage is a current and future struggle.
- Innovation needs to be alternative to labour
- Transfer of knowledge will be lost with retirements; will leave a lack of skillset in the industry.

Chair – What is the VRCA doing about this?

President:

- Honorary Board of Governors was initiated April 6 to retain and engage former Board members as a key resource
- Ongoing School Connection volunteer program is taking members to high school students.
- sourcing programs for Grade 3 5 students, to create attraction from younger ages
- speaking with school career counsellors to present construction as an equally prestigious option
- o speaking to parents to bust myths
